## Day trip to Morgan and Mt Mary Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> of May, 2021.

This made for fast travel and she earned the nick- name "Greyhound of the Murray". She originally worked in the Murrumbidgee area but came to the Murray in 1919 and carried produce from Berri to the rail head at Morgan until 1925. From 2010 restoration of the Canally has been the project of volunteers in Morgan. Major progress has stalled just now as it is proving impossible to get a shipwright to work on the next stage.

We then went over to the Museum, housed in the Landseer Building, an old warehouse and bond store from the glory days of Morgan. Built in 1878 this is the only remaining of several such buildings, required for such a busy port and railhead. The displays were informative and interesting but five eye catching tapestries were quite amazing to see. Depicting different eras of Morgan, they are works of art for all to enjoy.

A bit after 12 noon, we were off to Mt Mary for lunch. Once we had ordered Brenton Jones, who was a regular visitor to Mt Mary as a kid, gave us some ideas about this little town in its heyday. He and his brother stayed with their grandparents in a house (only 200m from the pub) for weekends and their school holidays. They helped their grandpa, who sold mallee wood for the city fires, trapped rabbits and got up to some mischief as well!!! Thank you, Brenton for bringing Mt Mary and district of the 1950s and 60s to life for us.



### Lloyd Griffith Car Museum— Alawoona

Sunday 16th May 2021

**Trip leader Neil Jacka.** Gathering at Loxton 9.00 am 15 vehicles - 37 people made their way to Lloyds 35,000 acre farm south of Alawoona, here Lloyd also has a very impressive car collection, housed in huge exgrain sheds. There were numerous other very large sheds filled with farm machinery, harvesters, tractors, stationary engines, boats and other types of cars. If you are a Holden fan then you would have loved the first shed. Most of us have owned one at some stage in our lives, so it was a walk down memory lane. From the very first Holden through to Monaros, Toranas, Commodores and not to forget the "Kingswood".



We moved from the first to the second large shed with, yes, more cars. This one housed a collection of early Toyota Landcruisers, Honda motor bikes and a variety of other cars and motor bikes. Including a V12 Lamborghini Diablo, old Buick and Dodge cars, a Triumph Bonneville, a BSA bantam and an early Raleigh motor bike, the of which was raced at the Isle of Man TT races in the 1930s. All in working order. Each shed had been sealed along the roof and floor to keep out the mallee dust, of which there is plenty.

We set up the BBQ in yet another shed and enjoyed a sausage and onion cook up. Followed by home made cake cooked by Sandra, YUM! It was a good catch up day. 3 very friendly farm dogs and a pet crow named 'Dad' helped us eat a few sausages and made themselves known to everyone. Lloyd was the perfect host, full of information on his collection and his farm. He started up a Detroit Diesel stationary engine which got the attention of the men. The scale of sheds and the massive collection of vehicles, farming equipment and stores is unbelievable. We returned to Alawoona via Schell Well which is an old government well, sunk to encourage people to settle and farm the area.
